TPP, the Trans-Pacific Partnership, is a massive new free trade agreement currently being negotiated between the US, Canada, Mexico, Peru, Chile, Australia, New Zealand, Malaysia, Brunei Darussalam, Singapore, and Vietnam, and Japan. TPP will allow factory farm corporations to sell their heavily subsidized products overseas at lower prices than those countries' domestically produced animal products. The result will be more people eating animal products – almost all of which will be from factory farms. In order to compete with US imports, producer of animal products in these countries will shift towards factory farming to stay competitive. TPP nations will also be forced to adopt US food safety standards – including dropping bans on dangerous drugs like Ractopamine. According to the Animal Legal Defense Fund, “On the factory farm, ractopamine is mixed into animal feed to make leaner meat. Its actual effects run the gamut in bringing about suffering. Ractopamine is known to cause tremors, chronically elevated heart rates, broken limbs, higher risks of hoof lesions, and death in farm animals. Scientists associate the drug with both non-ambulatory (“downer”) and over-excited behavior.” TPP will also encourage US imports from Vietnam's polluting shrimp farming industry, which destroys coastal mangrove rainforests and contributes to climate change.
